Time Commitment	Legislators will determine the internship start date. All students must start no later than January 8, 2025 (during the winter break) in alignment with the start of the legislative session. Internships will run through May 2025. Some legislators may request interns to begin as early as December. Each legislator will determine the schedule and weekly time commitment with their selected fellow, but the <i>minimum</i> commitment is 10 hours per week for the duration of the internship. As this is a fast-paced 90-day legislative session, flexibility is required, and students should expect weekly hours to fluctuate widely throughout the session depending on legislative workload.
